In Dreaming Blackness, Melanye T. Price explores the current understanding s of Black

She argues that Black Nationalism continues to enjoy moderate levels of support by most black citizens but has a more difficult time gaining a larger stronghold because of increasing diversity among blacks and a growing emphasis on individualism over collective
