The thirteen articles in this volume deal with the Neo-Latin emblem book after the birth of the genre with Andrea Alciato's *Emblematum libellus* (1531). While

the interest in emblematics has grown considerably during the last decades, the seminal Neo-Latin production has received relatively little attention. In *Mundus Emblematicus* an international team of experts in the field makes this part of the emblem tradition accessible to a broad scholarly audience. The articles cover a variety of emblem books published at the time, ranging from influential humanist collections (for instance those by Achille Bocchi, Hadrianus Junius, or Joachim Camerarius) to alchemist (Michael Maier) or religious emblems (such as the books of the Calvinist Theodore de Beze, or the Jesuit Herman Hugo). Moreover, several articles explore the interaction between the emblem and connected literary phenomena, like the commonplace-book, the fable or the use of commentaries. All papers are in English and all examples from Latin texts are translated. Together, these articles show the variety within the Neo-Latin emblem production, thus challenging traditional approaches of the emblem. As such *Mundus Emblematicus* contributes towards a



more comprehensive view of the forms and functions of the genre as a whole.
